AGREEMENT

concluded between the Administrations of GERMANY, BELGIUM, FRANCE and LUXEMBOURG concerning the co-ordination in the frequency bands 890-915 MHz and 935-960 MHz



1 - INTRODUCTION

The representatives of the Administrations of Belgium, Germany, France and Luxembourg have concluded under Article 6 of the Radiocommunications Regulatory, the following Agreement for the co-ordination in the fréquency bands 890-915 MHz and 935-960 MHz, of the Terrestrial Mobile Service in order to prevent the mutual harmfull interferences and optimise usage of the spectrum on the basis of mutual agreement.

In Germany, Belgium, France and Luxembourg, the frequencies bands 890-915 MHz et 935-960 MHz are designated for the "Global System for Mobile Communications (GSM)", in application fo the ERC/DEC/(94)01 Decision.

Consequently, the Administrations of Germany, Belgium, France and Luxembourg agreed on the following co-ordination procedure for the GSM systems, in the framework of the last version of the «Agreement concluded between the Administrations of Autria, Belgium, Tchek Republic, Germany, France, Hungaria, the Netherlands, Croatia, Italie, Liechtenstein, Lituania, Luxembourg, Poland, Romania, Slovak Republic, Slovenia and Switzerland for the de co-ordination of fréquencies between 29,7 MHz and 39,5 GHz for the Fixed Service and the Terrestrial Mobile Service (Berlin, November 18th 2003) », named here after « Agreement 2003 ».

2 - CO-ORDINATION PROCEDURE

This co-ordination procedure is based on the preferential frequency concept. The frequency bands 890-915 MHz and 935-960 MHz are divided in blocks of preferentials frequencies and non preferential for each Administration as showen below :

For the GSM900, the formula to calculate the central frequency is :

F in MHz (uplink) = 890 + 0,2*n

F in MHz (downlink) = 935 + 0.2*n,

n = 1 to 124 and n is the channel number.

The provision 4.2.4 of the « Agreement 2003 » does not apply.

2.1 Preferential frequencies :

For a preferential frequency, the fieldstrength level shall not exceed the maximum value of 19 dB (μ V/m) at 3 m above the ground on a 15 km line inside the other country.

2.2 Non preferentials frequencies :

For a non preferential frequency, the fieldstrength level shall not exceed the maximum value of 19 dB (μ V/m) at 3 m above the ground on every point of the boarder.

2.3 Fieldstrength prediction

The fieldstrength level will be calculated with the official common version of the Harmonised Calculations Method « HCM », as indicated in the « Agreeement 2003 ».

3 - REVISION

Each Administration can request a revision of this Agreement. Each part of this Agreement can be revised in the light of the future developments on the usage of those frequency bands.

4 - WITHDRAWING AND ABROGATION OF THE AGREEMENT

Each Administration may withdraw from this Agreement subject to 6 months notice.

5 - LANGUAGE

This Agreement exists in French and English languages in four original versions each Administration having an original version in each languages, both texts being equally authoritative.

6 - DATE OF ENTRY INTO FORCE

This Agreement enters into force on the 2nd of May 2005.
